
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COVID-19 and the food & beverage industry

> And a significant number of companies that had not planned to spend on technology are budgeting for it now.


34% said they are considering upgrading or purchasing CRM software. Other solutions high on the list: HR management software (25%), quality management systems (22%) and supply chain software (21%).
